We are coming towards the end of an academic year like no other at Blue Coat Primary School. There have been



significant challenges for both staff and pupils associated with COVID and lockdown, both on an academic front but also with regards to wellbeing. Whilst we very much hope that things will be more "back to normal" after the school holidays, we are acutely aware that this may take some time.

Despite all of the challenges, we have still had an abundance of fun at school. As I write this, I can hear the laughter from children who are out at break time and I have returned from a class where I have seen children engrossed in their learning. We are truly blessed to be spending this year with a group of people who cannot help but put a smile on one's face: the children. As anyone who works with children will attest, they are an incredibly resilient, optimistic and determined group. They have shown our Christian Values of hope, thankfulness and happiness throughout the year, whether they were learning at school or at home.

We have had plenty of reasons to celebrate, just as any other year. Recently, we have been delighted that Maddy in Key Stage 1 has been recognised for her artwork as part of the Diocese of Gloucester's Reflections in Faith (shown below). This was chosen to be commended among entries from over 300 schools in Gloucestershire. Of her art, Maddy says:



"My card shows the Easter story. Jesus was crucified on the big cross in the middle. The story doesn't end there because on Sunday Jesus comes alive again. My picture is the Sunday because Jesus is not on the cross anymore. Flowers and butterflies show it is a happy time."

Throughout this year Mrs Blaken has found innovative new ways to ensure that Religious Education has remained inspiring and inclusive for our children. Our Zoom visits from Reverend Morag as well as visitors from other faiths have meant that our children had a wonderful time in their learning.

Many other aspects of school have continued, maybe not as normal but as
