COVID Update:

We have a Hub Covid focus team who have been meeting each month to make sure we are compliant with any new Government guidelines (of which there have been MANY!!) The team has worked particularly hard to ensure that the staff, volunteers and customers are warm AND safe this winter. We have been monitoring the CO2 levels for a while in the Hub and by keeping the windows open and with our ventilation system bringing in fresh air, we only need to open the door occasionally to keep the air quality within the safe limits as recommended by the World Health Organisation. With the heating on, it creates a lovely warm and welcoming atmosphere for everyone. We also frequently clean surfaces and touchpoints, encourage all our customers, staff and volunteers to wear a mask and ask you to sanitise your hands on the way in.

Parish Council - December & January 2021-22

Meetings continue to be held in the Village Hall, minutes are available on the PC website and village notice boards. The council made comments on planning applications and an enforcement appeal. The link to make your own comment to Stroud District Planning on any applications affecting you is:https://publicaccess.stroud.gov.uk/online-applications

The Parish Council wants to create **safer roads** for all road users, whether on foot, rubber or hoof. Please read our **Chairman's Report** on the PC website or contact the Clerk for a hard copy.

Each year we provide **grants to charities and organisations** which support the North Nibley community. We are now taking applications with a closing date of 28th February 2022. Please email clerk@northnibleyparishcouncil.org.uk for an application form. District Councillor Braun told the Parish Council of two Community Wellbeing Grants The smaller grant scheme is open to non-commercial organisations. Applications will be accepted all year long and a panel will meet to consider them every three months. Stroud District Council will do their first small grants panel in March (the larger grants panel is in February). Applications should be sent to hwb@stroud.gov.uk Details about Small Grants and the applications form can be found on the SDC website: www.stroud.gov.uk/community-health-and-wellbeing/community-wellbeing-grants.

Owl boxes are nearly finished and we will be looking to meet with the school soon to see how we can get the children involved in this exciting project for wildlife in the cemetery.

Proposed Village Play area facilities:

My name is **Nick Riddiford** and I have been working with the Parish Council on the proposal to provide a new play area facility for North Nibley.

We would like to invite you to a public information meeting, so we can engage with the community to better understand what the people of North Nibley would like to see in that new play area.

Our Vision-

As I'm sure most people are aware, the current play provision is limited to a younger age bracket and is somewhat old.

That provision is owned and managed by Stroud District Council. Parish Council decided that this, and the responsibility of its maintenance, was best left with the District Council. while additional play area for a broader age range would be put in place by Parish Council working with the people of North Nibley.

The Parish Council own the Jubilee Playing Field, therefore this is currently deemed best proposed location. However, the finer detail has yet to be agreed as there are several stakeholders to liaise with. These include, but are not limited to:



How much will it cost?



We estimate that we need to raise £40,000 which will provide 7 pieces of equipment. Fundraising for this project is one of the massive tasks that we need help with, so we are looking for willing volunteers to come forward to assist in raising the funds.

Unless I am very much mistaken, they usually sleep from November through to March – a behaviour pattern my husband would very much like to emulate.

Whatever is happening in our world? The seasons are changing: Covid has thrown us all into chaos and it's hard to make plans, even now, as so much seems uncertain.

Little Angel Gets Her Wings

Before Christmas, Miss Allen and Miss Tyers, Class teachers for Classes 1 and 2, felt that we could continue our proud tradition of an annual infant nativity safely, if appropriate measures were put in place for any adult visitors, and so rehearsals began. We were able to stage two performances of 'Little Angel Gets Her Wings', each

time for a limited number of parents. Later I asked the 6 and 7 year olds to write down some of their thoughts. A good 'recount' piece of writing answers the 'Who, what, where, when and why' questions, so the children wrote around that structure. I have cherry-picked a number of their comments, as well as some others that appeared, in order to tell the story of our nativity.

- We do a nativity every year. This year, our nativity was called 'Little Angel Gets Her Wings'. It took place in the school hall. We practiced our nativity because we wanted to get it right for the real thing. I was nervous before we started. Every child in Classes 1 & 2 took part. We were so excited!
- My favourite song was 'On The Road To Bethlehem.' which was near the start.
- Unfortunately, (which was our word of the day) two of us were ill.
 Fortunately, one volunteered to switch parts.
- On Wednesday I was a camel but on Thursday I was a donkey!
- I was a sheep.
- I was an angel.
- I was a narrator.
- My favourite song was 'Allelujah'.
- Mine was 'Light Up The World'.
- We did it to entertain the grown-ups.
- It cheered everyone up.
- It was fun!

In the story, Little Angel has to walk everywhere because she hasn't yet earned her wings. As she solves problems and shows love to the different creatures she meets on her way to Bethlehem, she earns her wings. Ultimately, it turns out that the donkey she aided was needed by Mary, the mother of Jesus, and the dove and the lamb were also on their way to the stable, to mark the events of that first Christmas.



As we care for those around us in 2022, we do not know the impact they will have further down the road.
Go care-fully, then, into this brand new year.
